> The 2010 census reported its populations at 6,605. After the state of Illinios was established in 1818, the constitution gave each county the opportunity to adopt civil government in its survey townships. It is written that by 1850, the first civil townships began functioning in Illinois. The earliest recorded civil government operation in Carlinville township was a meeting of township road and bridge commissioners in 1885.
