s YOU CAN TELL from this month's cover, during the month of February we celebrate two holidays that have a lot of historical significance: Lincoln's Birthday on February 12 and President's Day on February 15.

I don't necessarily call myself a historian, but I do enjoy history, and it was always my favorite subject in school. Because I work in Springfield on a daily basis, I am constantly reminded of our 16th President Abraham Lincoln. Lincoln lived most of his life in Springfield. He and his family lived here prior to moving to the White House and he practiced law in Springfield from 1834-1852.

The Old State Capitol where Lincoln said, "a house divided against itself cannot stand" and—of course—Oak Ridge Cemetery where Lincoln was buried after his assassination in Washington, D.C. With all these reminders in Springfield, I cannot help but think about our 16th President each day.

Over sixteen years ago now, the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum opened to the public in Springfield. I remember attending the dedication ceremony where President George W. Bush spoke, and how excited I was to see it open.

As remarkable as he was, it took more than 125 years for Lincoln to get his own presidential library and museum. I have visited the museum on several occasions and TOI has held events there as part of our Annual Educational Conference

A couple of my other favorite presidential museums include the Truman Library and Museum in Independence, MO, and the Kennedy Library and Museum in Boston.

There is so much history and you can spend hours and hours try to take everything in. I have personally challenged myself to visit all of the presidential libraries and museums around this great country in my lifetime. I've hopefully got a few years left so I can most likely achieve that goal!

While I would challenge all of you to visit the various presidential museums around this great country, I'd also like to challenge you, as we look toward the new term of office that begins in May, to set a goal for yourself, and

any new officials in your township, to attend an educational opportunity to learn more about your duties and responsibilities as a township official.
