

1410.13: Interim Supervisor

If the Supervisor of GA:

- is a defaulter and in arrears with the local GA Unit; or
- has misused, misappropriated, or converted to their own use or to the use of any other person any of the funds of the Unit; or
- is guilty of any other misconduct in office;

the governing body of the local GA Unit (in the case of a township, the board of town auditors) may remove the Supervisor and appoint a suitable person to be the supervisor, as follows:

- For a township of 4,000 persons or more, upon written request of the township supervisors, the board of town auditors appoints a Supervisor of GA who is a resident of such township. The town auditors fix compensation and term of office. The term of office cannot exceed the term of the board.
- The Interim Supervisor appointed must be acceptable to DHS. The interim appointee serves as Supervisor of GA until such time as the policies and procedures of the Unit are determined by DHS to be in compliance with its rules.
- If, after a reasonable time, an Interim Supervisor has not been appointed, or a person not acceptable to DHS has been appointed, DHS requests in writing, the county Public Aid Committee to appoint an acceptable Interim Supervisor (composition of the Public Aid Committee is defined in 1410.16).
- Subject to DHS approval, the body appointing the Interim Supervisor determines the compensation of the Interim Supervisor. Payment is made from the GA funds of the GA Unit.
- If the local Unit takes such action that DHS considers satisfactory and in compliance with its rules, the appointment of an Interim Supervisor is not ordered. A reasonable length of time is allowed.
- An Interim Supervisor may be removed, and appointment of another person made, in the same manner and for the same reasons as caused the initial appointment of an Interim Supervisor.
